



# Integrating ADSPP to Local Development Plans

# Issues and Concerns

- Resource-based conflicts
- Conflicting policies (IPRA, LGC, Tourism Law, Mining Act, NIPAS etc)
- Parallel Development Frameworks
- Limited support to the formulation of the ADSDPP
- Non-recognition and protection by state authorities of ICC/IP's inherent rights

# Long-term Recommendations

- Review of Laws towards an Omnibus Code for the Protection of ICC/IPs
- Harmonize work of key departments relevant to the ICC/IPs (DILG, NCIP, HLURB, DENR etc.)
- Standardize baseline data
- National mapping must be inclusive and participatory and must include the LGUs
- Capacity building of institutions and processes

# Interfacing ADSDPP and CDPs

- Joint Memorandum Circular: DILG, NCIP and NAPC
- Bases for any interfacing is dialogue, mutual respect and open communications between the LGUs and ICC/IPs
- Recognition that ADSDPP covers every facet of the communal life, culture and history of the ICC/IPs while the CDP is a local development plan with targeted goals.

# Interfacing ADSDPP and CDPs

- NGA's act as facilitator of the dialogue towards interfacing

# Interfacing Modalities

- Interfacing Substance: Interfacing workshop
- Interfacing Substance and Process:  
Mechanism for consultations and knowledge sharing
- Interfacing Priority Projects
- Mandatory harmonization of baseline data on ICC/IPs in CDP and ADSDPP
- Mandatory representation of ICC/IPs to the local councils and sectoral committees dealing with social development, environment and natural resources.

# Roles of NGAs

- DILG insures representation of ICC/IPs in local councils and in the structures for crafting the CDPs.
- NCIP initiates and coordinates the holding of interfacing workshops and for crafting the mechanism for IP representation in CDP formulation. It shall insure participation of LGUs in the ADSDPP formulation.
- NAPC shall coordinate and explore additional funding for implementation of the JMC
